10. THIS MONTHS TECH. TIP TO CLICK IS PRESENTED BY RAYES MURPHY

To meet the need for just a little more power and just a little better mileage, there is one solution which is cheap and easy.

Putting the exhaust gas out of the engine improves things considerably, but the "open" mufflers all seem to be too noisy. People who have tried them agree that glasspacks are really great for about half a mile and then they bust your ears. So what is needed is a quiet, low restriction muffler. A stock Corvette muffler is the answer, but use a stock turbo muffler not a regular one. It is just slightly louder than normal and you can feel the extra power and performance.

Installation is slightly harder than normal, since the tailer is a gigantic 3½ inches. However, take some wire which will reduce the hole to 2½, drill a 2½ inch hole which is simply a 2 inch piece of 2½ inch pipe. For a rear support, a 2 shaped piece of scrap can be hooked under the rear clamp and bolted to the body using a thick rubber pad as a shock mount. Because of the offset, a straight piece of 2½ inch pipe will take out the rear, just outward of the grill. Therefore you will lose no ground clearance.
