
Get Ready for Some Good Old Fashioned FUN!

the vintage Packsaddle covered bridge, which was built in 1870 right over a waterfall on Brush Creek.

While working our way toward the bridge along narrow Glen Savage Road, you may be startled by a huge statue of a Pennsylvania elk atop the entrance way to the Glen Savage Ranch. The ranch has a beautiful, rustic, barn like buffet restaurant that will be open ONLY TO US for an all you can eat, rest stop. The Shearers and Friends attest that it is a bargain at \$9.95 plus tax and your beverages. Take care of your own tab.

We will then press on to Gravity Hill where your senses "drive" you senseless.

Situated at the base of Laurel Mountain, Compass Inn served as a popular stagecoach stopover in the late 1700s and early 1800s. Costumed guides will teach you about the American frontier. If we have at least 20 stagecoach passengers we will get the group rate of \$5. The senior rate is also \$5.

IT IS VERY IMPORTANT THAT WE HAVE A REASONABLY GOOD IDEA OF HOW MANY ARE COMING, SINCE THE RANCH IS NOT NORMALLY OPEN FOR LUNCH, AND THE COMPASS INN NEEDS

TO KNOW HOW MANY GUIDES TO HAVE ON HAND. Everything on this tour is doable with an umbrella, so please, please come even if it is raining, and even if you bring your every day car.
