Bill Brill: 1919–2006

While in Buffalo, New York, for the CORSA International Convention, many of us learned of the passing of our dear friend and longtime WPCC Treasurer, Bill Brill. To Bill's family and especially Jean, his wife we extend our deepest sympathy for their loss.

You may recall reading in the Jan/Feb 2006 issue of the *Vair Street Journal* that Bill Brill received a special appreciation award for his many, many years of service to WPCC as Treasurer. The award was presented to Bill at his home by Al and Carol Friend.

Since he retired as treasurer, Bill hasn't been involved in this Club because of health issues, but I think I speak for everyone when I say we've missed him and will continue to do so in the future.

About Bill, Jim Heatherington said, "Suzanne and I were deeply saddened to hear of Bill's death. He was always a gentleman and a pleasure to travel with. Jean, you have our sympathy and prayers".

What follows is the obituary as printed in the *Pittsburgh Tribune-Review*. As you read, you will see that Bill was a very involved person.



william L. Brill, 86, of W Greensburg, died Monday, July 24, 2006, in Excela Health Westmoreland Hospital, Greensburg. He was born Aug. 13, 1919, in Greensburg, the son of the late Samuel and Anna Shendowich Brill. He was the former manager of the A&M Supermarket, Irwin, and the Pennsylvania Food Merchants Association of Harrisburg. He was a member of Temple Emanu-EI Israel of Greensburg and member and past president of Beth Israel Synagogue of Latrobe. He was a life member and past president of B'Nai Brith; was a World War II veteran, having served with the U.S. Army Air Corps; a life member and past vice commander of Jeannette American Legion Post 344; past president and treasurer of the Western Pa. Corvair Club; member and past president of the B'Nai Israel Cemetery Committee; and a member of F&AM No. 601 Shidle Lodge of Irwin. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by three sisters, Ruth Moldovan, Florence Dobkin and Dorothy Brill. He is survived by his wife, Jean




The meeting was called to order by Vice President Tim Desmond.



The convention certainly wasn't bad either.










