


football game. I guess the Black and Gold come first no matter what else is happening.

The big winner was Bob Tedesco (ironic how the raceway's owner won?).

Fastest time recorded was held by Jim Madden in his 1966 Corsa

at 18.136 seconds and the fastest speed of the day was held by Don Cekus in his 1965 four door at 75.7 miles per hour.

Every car enthusiast dreams of racing their car and this was an experience that most of us will not forget. It just goes to show that these little cars still have guts!
