I wish we would have had a better showing for this event. It would make













our club look stronger and present a better image for potential members.




corsa at Ventura-The Road Trip New Orleans


the existing old levee is still prone to

Next came the cars. The picture above has ten Corvairs, but there was actually an eleventh, which happened to be




