
Wayne Rockhill—1938-2001

Wayne Rockhill, President of the Western Pennsylvania Corvair Club died on Wednesday, October 3, 2001 after taking ill in May.

Soft spoken and liked by everyone who knew him, Wayne was a well known Pittsburgh area architect who worked out of his Venetia home where he lived with his wife, Doreen.

Wayne was father to Wendy Lee (Greg) Hunter and Kenneth Rockhill by his first wife, the late Mary Jane Knapp Rockhill. He was also stepfather of Missy (Steven) Gradert and Richard Swan; brother of Susan Rockhill and Linda (Fred) Grim; uncle of Duane Wolff and Douglas Wolff; greatuncle of Marisa Wolff; also survived by grandchildren, Andrew Stormy, Rebecca, Billy and Anna Marie.

This was Wayne's second time around as WPCC President, having served the Club in that capacity in the early 1980s. He was a staunch supporter of the Club and an active member who participated in its many, many events. Wayne will be sorely missed.

- 8) Ask people why they have deer heads on their walls, and they tell you it's because they're such beautiful animals. I think my wife is beautiful, but


- I only have photographs of her on the wall.


Holiday Party-January 5, 2002-Carmody's Restaurant
