





HANGER ON A ROPE





BIG SNAKE




- 1 - 3 PICK UP OBJECTS




Jay & Betty States have moved back to Canfield, Ohio from the southwest. We're sure glad ya'll changed your minds. Hope to see you at the gatherings.



Engine Shroud Seals for Early Engines

When the engine shroud seals are replaced on early engines, original-type staples can be home built from stainless steel wire being a preferable, such as illustrated below.

SYSTEM FROM

N. TEXAS
TRANSAXLE
TELEGRAMS



A steel wire, slightly thinner than 5/32", needs to allow for bending back of the wire, is fastened to a piano surface to hold the wire. A through hole is made the "tongue" of the wire. Twisting one side of the metal is a convenience.

Place about twelve of about 1/32" dia. wire in the clamp, then bend the ends over. Then apply the ends of the clamps. Therefore, the formed staple should measure about 1/16" inside, which means the wire will fit the existing staple holes without being about 13/32" diameter or wider.

At installation the staple should be twisted up with a split support while the gasket is clamped tight and the ends of the staple are forced over with a tool, hammer, etc.

Fixed in place.
