



CORSA Membership in recognition of their 50-years of supporting the Corvair hobby.



### Staying on Target...

s we wind down 2023, I wanted to give everyone a detailed schedule for deadlines for the next year's worth of

issues of the *Communique'*. With the realities of paper shortages and the resulting delays that they cause, I wanted to make sure that contributors, advertisers and the general membership had a solid handle on the production schedule. This will help with the timely publication of everything the magazine is comprised of, including convention previews, feature articles, display ads, event listings, classifieds and other notices.

As one can see from the schedule, we work on a six-week lead time for a given issue, so something that absolutely has to be in the

magazine, say for the January/February, issue, it needs to be in by November 15th to be in without question. Now, there is a little bit of wiggle room there, the period of time between "soft deadline" and a "drop dead," but it's no longer guaranteed to get in. # Director's Turn at the Wheel- David Dean, Ph.D. Mesa, AZ

and writer, Cicero once said, "We were born to unite with our fellow-men [and women] and to join in the community with others." Since I am writing to members of the Corvair Society of America (CORSA), I want to emphasize that we too are a community — a society, a world-wide organization with more than 3,000 members and 110 local chapters across the globe. The Society is our community.

Because we are a group of Corvair enthusiasts, CORSA, a non-profit organization, was incorporated to satisfy the common needs of individuals interested in the Corvair. As the bylaws state, the purpose of the Society is to "provide an organization which satisfies the common needs of individuals interested in the operation, preser-

vation, restoration, and enjoyment of the Corvair automobile and its derivatives." Among the Society's objectives are to aid and encourage the ownership, preservation, and enjoyment of all Corvair vehicles by providing publications with technical, historical, and social activities, promote local, regional, and national social events, guide chapters of the Society, establish standards for conducting participacompetitive events, and encourage the availability Corvair parts, and offer items of memorabilia to Society members. Yes, I am preaching to the choir, and all this is to say that the Society is, in many ways, a car club. Car clubs are indeed examples of Cicero's communities born to unite

Since the audience for this article is predominantly subscribers to the Communique', who are members of the Society, let me focus on how we join our community with others, as Cicero admonishes. The Corvair Preservation Foundation (CPF), - an affiliate of CORSA - is an independent 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation dedicated to preserving and promoting the history of the Chevrolet Corvair. This other organization, related to our shared passion for Corvairs, is open to all automotive history aficionados and those that support the mission of the Foundation to document all aspects of Corvair history and to preserve significant Corvair artifacts for the enjoyment and education of the

public. The Foundation is 100% funded solely from its own tax-deductible memberships and donations. Moreover, membership in CORSA does not provide membership in the CPF – and vice versa. While enthusiasts are welcome and encouraged to join both, CORSA membership is not required for CPF membership.

The Foundation's vision is to be the complete repository of Corvair history. Its two main functions of preservation and education are accomplished through its operation of the National Corvair Museum along historic Route 66 outside Springfield, Illinois; and administering the Frank Winchell Memorial Corvair Scholarship program, available to CPF and CORSA members, their children, grandchildren, etc. who are planning to enter their first year of college or vocational/trade school.

Interestingly, CORSA as a Society supports over 3000 enthusiasts, yet the Foundation has barely 120 members. Granted the Society functions as an active car club, supporting the cars and their usage, my encouragement here is to have CORSA members consider the Foundation's role in the long-term preservation of the Corvair legacy. I challenge Society members consider joining the Foundation and support the Corvair for future generations

Now the Foundation is moving into a new endeavor to build a permanent location for the National



Museum and CPF operations. This capital campaign needs support from both Society members and automobile enthusiasts from all communities. One of the strongest ways we can demonstrate the importance of the Corvair is to show what these cars mean to us. As a CORSA Director, I am calling on the Foundation to start a new member initiative alongside the capital campaign to preserve the legacy of the Corvair and their owners.

I am asking for two new preservation actions. First, when folks join the Foundation, include a photo of the Corvair they own or drove, and stories or memories of how they enjoyed these cars, to be preserved and displayed by the Foundation at the museum or online. This will share our community with others. Secondly, I am asking the Foundation to recognize significant capital campaign donors that drove/have owned a Corvair with a memorial display that

includes recognition of their cars. Society members should consider when they retire from Corvair ownership, or pass their car along to a new steward, to offer the proceeds of their sale as a donation to the Foundation. This will preserve your Corvair story for generations to come. Society members should also think about including a legacy gift in their estate to the Foundation, passing their love for the Corvair on to others through

preservation of Corvair history.

The Society and the Foundation, two organizations connected at the heart. The Society for keeping our cars on the road and enjoying the experience of Corvair ownership; and the Foundation for preserving Corvair history and the legacy of our community for future generations. Consider joining the Foundation today and planning for your generous gift to preserve our shared history. Happy Motoring!

'm pleased to announce that we will be having a CPF/National Corvair Museum "Stars and Stripes Spectacular" event featuring a display of some of the original Zenobia Shriner Corvairs at the Dayton CORSA Convention that

will be held at the Marriott at The University of Dayton on July 21-26, 2024. I've also been in contact with the local Dayton Antioch Shrine Temple to possibly do an event to bring awareness and hopefully, donations to their Shriner's

Dayton Burn Hospital while honoring the history of the Shriner Corvairs. We're also extending a special invitation to the Toledo Zenobia Shrine Temple members (who originally created these cars) to join us for the festivities. It's an

Ohio thing!

The next step is finding other Shriner Corvairs to invite. If you or someone you know has any knowledge of where one of these unique late model convertibles are, please contact me as soon as possible at corvairlady@gmail.com. I've created a registry so we will know who the owners are, where the cars are located, along with detailed vehiinformation and photos. cle Currently, we only know of six Shriner cars and one Greenbrier van. There is currently one 1967 Shriner Corvair convertible available for sale in Bryan, Ohio, that I'm helping the elderly owner try to sell as he doesn't do any social media. If you are interested in this Corvair, please contact me at the same email address.

Brief History: From what I understand from the former original owners who had my 1967 Shriner Corvair, these cars were actually created by accident. According to long time Zenobia Shrine Temple senior member, Jim Winnie (who owned my car before giving it to his son, Keith, who then sold it to me) stated that a guy by the name of Tom O'Neill, who was a Northwest Ohio Shrine Club member (and also happened to own a Corvair at the time in 1973) had a U.S. flag that had gotten wet. He threw the flag on top of his Corvair to dry out and when he later went to remove it, he noticed that the faded imprint of the stars and

stripes remained on the car and he liked what he saw. Bingo! The idea was born and he later decided to have his Corvair (Shriner car #1) painted up in 1974. He then brought it to a Northwest Shrine Club meeting where Jim Winnie saw it and fell in love. Believe it or not, Jim relayed they were actually debating between whether they should use Corvairs or Mustangs for these Shriner cars! Yep! Thank goodness they chose Corvairs to represent their Shrine. Once the decision was made, some simple rules were put into place: You had to be a Mason, a Zenobia (NW Ohio) Shrine Temple member, the Corvairs had to be a late-model (1965-1969) convertible, and each member had to pay for their own car including the special stars and stripes paint job. The group decided on the Betsy Ross 13-star flag theme for its simple pattern and some of the guys were war veterans and due to the Vietnam War still fresh in mind, they didn't want to disrespect the American flag. Jim bought his 1967 Corvair Monza convertible in 1975 (originally red in color) and it would have been Shriner car #2, however, he had to do some body work on it first and wound up being Shriner car #5. Jim had the car painted white first and then had the rest of it custom painted in order to get it ready for the first parade they would enter as a group - The Bicentennial parade in 1976. I was told the same guy painted the first five cars and six to eight cars were already painted by the time they appeared in the Bicentennial parade, according to Keith Winnie, Jim's son.

They organized a separate mobile car unit originally called the "Northwest Corvairs." It eventually became known as the "Corvair Club" under the banner of the Zenobia Shrine Temple. Once the Shriner's had created their separate club for these Corvairs, they went from simple rules to creating written by-laws. In addition to members buying their own Corvair and paying for the paint job, there were stipulations put in place as to how wide the stripes could be in order to keep the cars looking the same. If the club member wanted to sell his Corvair; he had to sell it to another Zenobia Shrine member. Also, only a male Shrine member was allowed to own and drive the cars in parades and special events. According to Jim Winnie, who is 97 years young and used to be a certified aircraft mechanic and pilot, stated that they even had a small Corvair Shriner newsletter where he wrote articles on tech tips on how to care for your Corvair. Jim got a lot of that information from joining CORSA and reading articles in the Communique'. Sadly, they didn't save any of these newsletters for keepsake memories. Once the owners started getting older, could no longer work on their own vehicles, and some members had already passed on; the rules of who

could own a Shriner Corvair changed. Now these special cars are available to be owned and appreciated by other Corvair enthusiasts, including CPF President Mike Hall and myself.

Most of the Shriner Corvairs were equipped with CB radios (for parade communications), musical horns, Zenobia Shrine Temple

emblems, a Betsy Ross, Ohio, P.O.W/M.I.A., and U.S. flag that could be affixed to the chrome windshield header, custom front license plates with the Shriner member's name, Zenobia car magnets, and Shriner Corvair tie/shirt

pins. To be parade-correct, the Betsy Ross flag was flown on the driver's side of the car, Ohio flag in the middle (with the option for the P.O.W. flag), and the U.S. flag on the passenger side. The Shriners even had special outfits, shirts, red

wore when driving these cars in parades including a set of red or blue coverall jumpsuits in case the guys had to make repairs during parades in order to not mess up their good clothes. Most of the cars also had red car bras to protect the front end of their vehicle when not in parade use. I've included a photo of one of the original embroidered shirts created in the mid 1970s that I obtained from the former owner, Keith Winnie, along with a polo shirt that was created in the 1980s. I have a few extra new polo shirts that the Winnie family gave me along with some small Shriner Corvair pins that I've been gifting to those who own one of these special cars.

striped ties, and fez hats that they

The Shriner's wives also got involved in the Corvair Club and even had their own customembroidered shirts made and were known as the "Corvairettes." It was reported by Jim's wife, Irene (98 years young), that the wives found puppets to purchase at one event and they used them to entertain the children along the parade routes thereafter. My particular Shriner Corvair came equipped with all of the parade swag items mentioned in this article including a Daffy Duck puppet. I debuted my car at the 2023 Ypsilanti, Michigan's Fourth of July 200th birthday celebration parade. I fashioned the car with a handmade 1960s-looking sign I placed on each side of the vehicle indicating the year made

and where it was built. The folks absolutely loved seeing this Corvair in the parade as they chanted, "YPSI BUILT!" "YPSI BUILT!" and "GO WILLOW RUN!" all along the parade route. In addition, the kids loved seeing and yelling out to the Daffy Duck puppet waving at them. I even had some Rosie the Riveter parade participants encouraging me to join their group as a member, and I told them they could borrow my Corvair anytime for their future parades and events. After many years of living in Ypsilanti Township where my favorite car was built (Willow Run) to finally be able to have one of my Corvairs (especially this one) in a local parade was a dream come true.

By 1979, they had 10 Shriner Corvairs and one Greenbrier van. Here's a first time-revealed story about the origin as to why a Corvair Greenbrier van was added to the group's mobile unit. According to Jim Winnie, there was a guy by the name of Red Walters who wanted to be in the Corvair Club but he had allergies and was very skin sensitive to the sun so he couldn't purchase a convertible. To keep everything Corvair true, he bought a Greenbrier and painted it white with a red stripe. It was after he purchased the van that the group decided it served well as a mini Corvair parts department along with hauling parade supplies. When Red bought the van, it had a V-8 engine in it and was being used

for racing! Jim Winnie said that he a Corvair engine back into the van and other club guys helped him put to make sure it complied with



Clarence "Corvair air-cooled only" status. I'm sure there's an interesting backstory on how this conversion took place.

The Shriner Corvair Club members attended the 1979 Detroit CORSA Convention and had a photo taken of nine of their Corvairs at the GM Tech/Design Center which appeared on the cover of the October, 1979 isssue of CORSA Communique'. Jim Winnie's car is in that photo. By the mid-1980s, the number of Corvairs made for the Zenobia Shrine Temple grew from a subtotal of 13 cars and one van to a final grand total of 22 cars plus one Greenbrier. This 23 total vehicle figure was separately confirmed to me by another original senior Ohio Shrine member. After many years of speculating, we finally know how many were made.

One final little story that I thought would be cool to share was when Jim and Keith Winnie told me about taking their former '67 Shriner Corvair to an Oshkosh Fly-in event in the early 1990s. At the event, it was a tradition to parade performing pilots up and down the flight line in vehicles. A photo was taken and published in the November, 1992 issue of Plane & Pilot magazine of Jim Winnie (who was a flight engineer on C-47s and C-46s during WW2) driving his Shriner Corvair with five WW2 P-51 flying ace pilots on board who were none other than Chuck Yeager, Thomas Hayes, Clarence "Bud" Anderson, Chesley "Pete" Peterson, and Leonard "Kit" Karson.

Shriner Fun Facts: Founded as the Ancient Arabic Order of the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine in 1870, the fraternity's first official meeting was in 1871 and the Mecca Temple was the first chapter established in 1872. There are now more than 195 chapters in countries around the world under the Shriner's International banner.

In order to be a Shriner, you have to be a member of a Masonic lodge (be a Mason).

According Shriners International, they are a "fraternity based on fun, fellowship and the Masonic principles of brotherly love, relief and truth." Shriners are one of the world's largest fraternities and philanthropic organizations consisting of men of good character who seek fellowship, brotherhood, family support, selfimprovement through education, community involvement, and serve others through resources of its Shriner's Children's hospitals, and numerous other activities. The Shriners are known for their parades which included vehicles like Corvairs and Rupp Chevy Jr. go-karts. Parade rule fact: You can only be a Shrine member to be in a parade route from beginning to end. The Northwest Shrine Club (within the Zenobia Shrine Temple) encompassed the four counties in Northwest Ohio which included






